Behaviour Management Policy



Outcome

To provide an environment that is safe and supportive by encouraging and promoting socially acceptable behaviour. This applies to all facets of Kalgoorlie School of Air teaching where staff is solely responsible for students.

Process

At the beginning of each term, all students start with Good Standing.

All staff and school community are encouraged to foster and model positive relationships with their students. When working with students, staff will give positive attention to desired behaviours by way of listening, praise, smiles, affirmations, encouragement and positive reinforcements. Staff will deal with negative behaviours in a calm, fair and consistent manner.

At the beginning of each year, teachers and students develop clear classroom rules to guide online and classroom behaviour.

At the beginning of each camp and in-school visit, teachers discuss rules and acceptable behaviours with students.

The 3 main considerations are:

1. Respect is shown for others.
2. Be a good sport.
3. Listen to others

Consequences

The following procedures will be put in place:

1. A display of unacceptable behaviour results in a warning followed by an explanation of what the child has done wrong and suggested alternative appropriate behaviour;
2. A second display of unacceptable behaviour results in “timeout” from the activity, under supervision; and
3. A third display of unacceptable behaviour results in collaborative behaviour meeting with student, teacher and Support Teacher Learning to discuss acceptable behaviour.
4. A fourth display could result in the loss of good standing and could impact on attendance at camps and excursions.

Note

Whilst staff will endeavour to follow these guidelines, there may be circumstances where staff will need to use discretion.
